# Department V

## General Livestock Rules

Use a **BLUE** entry form, please.

### ENTRY TIMES

Rabbits/Cavies between 2-4:00 pm Thursday.

All other Animals 3-5:00 Thursday.

1. Animal department rules are called to the attention of the exhibitor. Be familiar with the rules.
  2. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any damage done to or occasioned by or arising from any animal exhibited by hi/.her and shall indemnify the Castle Rock Fair against all legal or other power for safe preservation of all stock and articles on exhibit, and all property of every character entered for competition or display or for any other purpose, or being anywhere on the Fairgrounds shall be subject to control of the fair management. In no case will management be responsible in any way for any loss, damage, or injury of any character to any property while the same is on the Fairgrounds. If exhibitor or others interested in the exhibit desire protection against loss, damage or injury from fires or any other cause, must make their own protection arrangements prior to entry.
  3. Any animal causing a disturbance will be sent home at the discretion of the superintendent/ the fair manager.
  4. All animals must be groomed and in good show condition upon arrival and during open hours of the fair.
  5. Livestock exhibitors will at all times give necessary and personal attention to their exhibits (animal, cage, stall or pen).
  6. The VETERNARIAN for the fair will be available for animal inspection Thursday, 3:00-5:00pm. Animals will be inspected prior to being unloaded. The superintendent/ veterinarian may reject an animal due to illness or cleanliness.
  7. All animals must be at the fairgrounds no later than 5pm Thursday and must not be removed from the fairgrounds before the fair closes on Saturday.
  8. Animal exhibitors will not be allowed to sleep in the barns or on the fairgrounds at night. The fair will provide adequate protection for the livestock.
  9. No animals with horns will be allowed at the fair.
  10. Each exhibitor is responsible for properly entering his/her animals and must have continuous ownership of the animal by May 1<sup>st</sup> prior to fair dates. See Beef/Dairy Rules.
  11. Open Class animal exhibitors need to contact department superintendent by July 1<sup>st</sup>.
  12. All clubs are responsible for their stalls to be cleaned down to the floor after the fair closes and before herdsman ship monies will be paid.
  13. All animal exhibitors must obtain a pass before entering any classes. Passes may be purchased at the office or when you enter your animal. No pass. No premiums.
- **Each animal will be judged for type.**
  - **Each 4H and FFA exhibitor must enter Fitting and Showing Class for his/her animal.**
  - **Enter your animal in only one lot/class. (No cross entries.)**
  - **Each exhibitor is encouraged to enter an educational display/poster for his/her animal division.**
  - **All educational exhibits are to be entered under Department VI, Division L.**
  - **Herdsman ship will be paid by day. To be fair to other exhibitors, absences need to be approved by superintendents prior to the fair, or partial or no premium will be paid per superintendents' discretion.**

5. No dog is to be allowed to bark unnecessarily. Each exhibitor is responsible for the conduct and control of dog at all times.
6. Exhibitors are requested to use only designated areas to exercise and groom dogs.
7. Dog must be cleaned and fully groomed. Cleaning supplies and utensil will be available.
8. Dogs must remain on the fairgrounds until 7:00PM as weather permits.
